Requirements: Students will have:

- ◇ Completed a didactic program in dietetics accredited by the ACEND; received a verification statement of completion of the knowledge requirements or an intent to graduate statement.
- ◇ A minimum undergrad GPA of 3.0.
- ◇ Completed a statistics course within the last 5 years.
- ◇ Completed a medical nutrition therapy course within the last 5 years.
- ◇ Earned a C or better in undergraduate advanced nutrition, A & P and Biochemistry courses.

Details

- ◇ Supervised practice requirements established by the ACEND.
- ◇ Applied Dietetics Practice courses utilize food service management, community and clinical facilities in the local area.
- ◇ 39 semester credits.
- ◇ 5 consecutive semesters (21 months) as a full-time student.
- ◇ A cohort of 8 students (through the D&D Digital Spring Match).
